Open natural ecosystems (ONEs) are unique ecosystems that make up more than 10% of India's geographical area. They support a variety of flora and fauna that often get overlooked in India's biodiversity conservation plans. Grasslands are home to many threatened wildlife species, such as the great Indian bustard, Indian grey wolf, blackbuck and the lesser florican.

Great Indian Bustard

The great Indian bustard is a Critically Endangered species, once present throughout open natural ecosystems in India. They typically lay one egg per year, but the chicks and eggs are vulnerable to predators. The last viable population is now found in western Rajasthan.

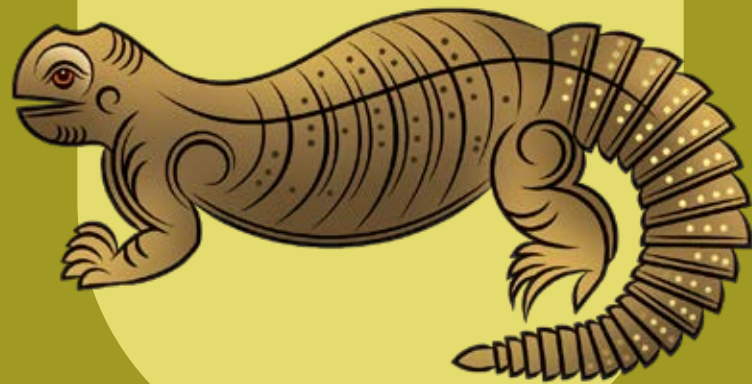

Spiny-Tailed Lizard

This herbivorous lizard has a broad head, a stout body and strong hind legs. Its tail has numerous protective spines that discourage most predators. The spiny-tailed lizard is found in the Great Thar Desert in India. It is illegally traded for its meat, blood, oil and skin.

Chinkara

The chinkara is a shy and graceful resident of the semi-arid grasslands. It feeds on the Indian jujube and Acacia trees in the grasslands. The colour of its coat allows the animal to blend in with the grasslands and avoid detection by predators. It can go without water for many days, deriving fluids from the dew and plants it feeds on.

Montagu's Harrier

They are long-distance migratory birds of prey that arrive in the Indian subcontinent in September to escape the harsh winter of Europe and Central Asia. They prefer open grasslands and feed primarily on grasshoppers, locusts and other insects, as well as reptiles and rodents.

Blackbuck

The blackbuck is native to the Indian subcontinent and is categorised as Endangered by the IUCN Red List. It lives in open grasslands and moves in herds. It has good eyesight and is a very fast runner, a defence against predators like wolves. Its population has declined due to poaching and loss of habitat.

Rock Agama

The rock agama is a lizard endemic to the peninsular India. It is often seen resting or basking on rocky boulders. The head and anterior part of the male turn red during breeding or when a rival male appears. In the breeding season, the female has tinges of orange and grey speckles on its body, helping it to blend in with the rocks. They consume ants and other insects.

Chestnut-Bellied Sandgrouse

A bird of arid and semi-arid grasslands, the chestnut-bellied sandgrouse feeds on grass seeds, flowers, small insects and fallen berries. The feathers on its belly are modified to act like a sponge. On hot days, adults soak their bellies in the water body and return to the nest to provide water to their chicks.

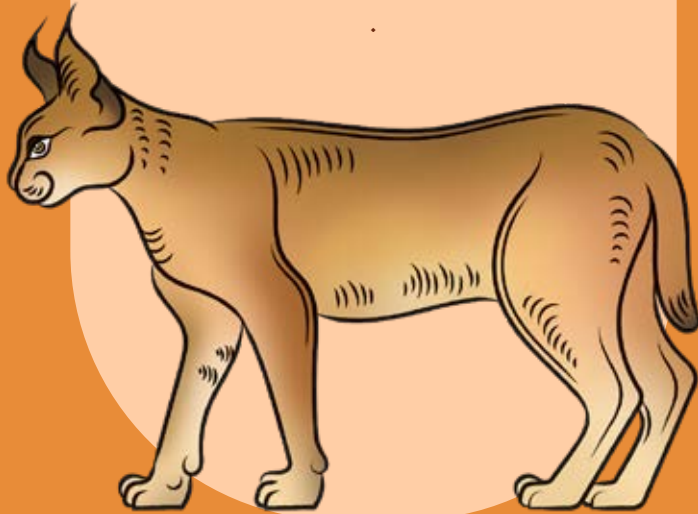

Caracal

The caracal is a small wild cat with long-tufted ears and a sandy-brown coat. It has a keen sense of hearing and a lithe body built to leap and catch birds in flight. It has been listed as Near Threatened by the IUCN Red List. Like the cheetah, it used to be a favourite coursing or hunting animal in medieval India.

Lesser Florican

The lesser florican is a bird of the open grasslands, endemic to the Indian subcontinent. The smallest in the bustard family, it is best known for its leaping breeding displays during monsoon. The males fold their legs to leap upward, reaching 2-3 m in height. The lesser florican is categorised as Critically Endangered by the IUCN Red List.

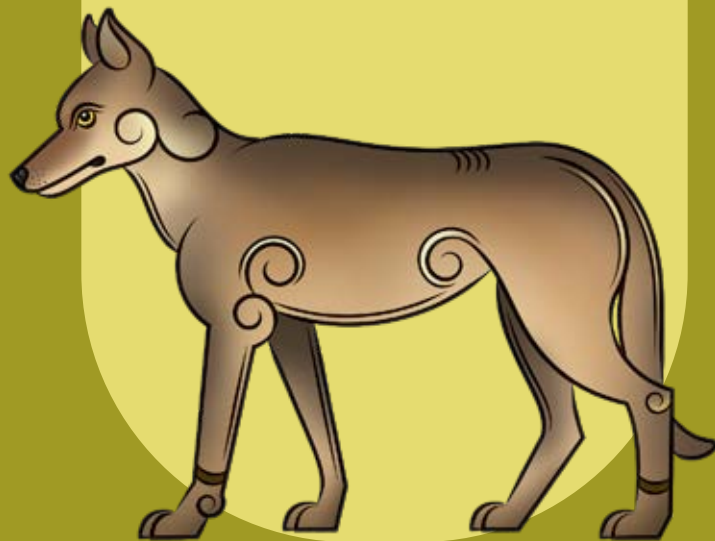

Indian Grey Wolf

Coming from an ancient lineage, the Indian grey wolf is a Schedule I species under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, categorised as Endangered according to the IUCN Red List. The Indian grey wolf is found in the savannah grasslands, village commons and agricultural lands, often sharing space with people and livestock.
